

Covid-19 catch up premium

Iron Acton Primary School is due to receive a total of £7,920 in catch-up funding in 2020 and 2021. Schools are required to use this funding for specific activities to support their pupils to catch up for lost teaching over the previous months.

While schools can use their funding in a way that suits their cohort and circumstances, they are expected to use this funding for specific activities which will help pupils catch up on missed education.

To improve progress and attainment for children in KS2 maths	Employ teacher for 2 terms to enable KS2 classes to be split for 3 days per week for maths, allowing teachers to focus on smaller numbers of children, providing effective feedback.	£5388	Achievement information for maths Pupil questionnaire
To improve progress and attainment for children in KS2 – all areas	Employ teacher for 2 terms to provide 3 afternoons of responsive intervention for those identified as needing it most, focusing specifically on those who are disadvantaged.	£829	Achievement information for reading, writing and maths Pupil questionnaire
To improve progress and attainment for children in KS1 – reading	Increase reading assistant hours to provide more opportunity for regular reading. Increase teaching assistant hours to provide more opportunity for high quality reading comprehension.	£470 £420	Achievement information for reading, writing and maths
To improve progress and attainment in reading and maths	Purchase additional work books and reading books for lowest 20%.	£470	Achievement information for reading and maths
