### Welcome back

Welcome back to Term 3. I'd like to wish every member of our school community a very Happy New Year. We were pleased to be able to continue with many of our usual Christmas events and celebrations before the break. We thank you all for supporting the school with these and hope you enjoyed the build up to Christmas, which is always a very special time of year for us in school.

The new term has started well and the children have settled back into their classes. So far, Covid rates across the school are low, but we have had a bout of chicken pox – please look out for this in your children and if you notice any signs, please let the school office know.

Schools in South Gloucestershire have received a new set of advice to limit the impact of Covid on children's education. As a result, we have made the following changes:

- All staff and visitors are required to wear a face covering in communal areas throughout the school
- Visits to the school are limited; we thank parents for their support by staying outside of the building
- Large gatherings have been cancelled; this includes whole school assemblies and collective worship
- Mixing of classes is limited and we have returned to a bubble system with 3 separate groups which do not mix inside (Bubble 1: Barn Owls & Falcons; Bubble 2: Buzzards; Bubble 3: Golden Eagles)
- Meetings in school are held online and social distancing is in place for adults in school

We are hopeful that the above measures will keep everyone as safe as possible but also enable every child to continue to receive as much face to face education as possible without too much disruption.

The school does have a contingency plan in place in the event that any class is unable to open. This may be due to infection rates or a shortage of staff. It is possible that a class may need to close unavoidably at very short notice. We apologise in advance if this is the case.

To continue to support the school, we ask that you:

- Arrange a PCR test if your child has any of the 3 main symptoms (persistent cough, temperature, loss or change to taste or smell) and keep them out of school until a negative result is received
- Follow any guidance from track and trace if your child is a close contact (this now involves children aged 5 upwards taking lateral flow tests for 7 days instead of self-isolating)
- Carry out lateral flow tests as a family twice each week
- Remain outside of the school building
